This is a tourist attraction center that introduces the traditional performing arts of the Asanogawa River area in Kanazawa and provides cultural experiences.

This hall introduces the culture of chaya (Geisha house), Kanazawa Geiko (geisha) and local activities of Asanogawa Enyukai. Located at the entrance to the chaya district, the

hall is a new information center that introduces the rich culture of the neighborhood.

The renovated traditional townhouse is one of the hall's highlights. Enjoy the beauty and elegance of the building during a stroll through the nearby chaya districts, and relax in the rest area overlooking the courtyard.
